

# **Christmas Stocking Project Ends**

Christmas Stockings for the children served by Metro Ministries, mainly in Harlem and Brooklyn, New York, will be accepted until Sunday, November 5.

Last year we sent a total of 182 filled stockings, 99 for girls and 83 for boys. These stockings go to children who get little or nothing for Christmas.

Many thanks to Gerri Reardon who makes it easy for the rest of us by sewing the felt stockings in huge quantities. Pick up a stocking or two from the display in the foyer and fill it as you would for your own children or grandchildren.

Return it to church by Nov. 5. The stockings will be boxed and shipped the following Monday.

Please be sure the stockings are able to be closed and contain no perishable items or glitter.

Let me encourage you, though, to make every day and every prayer one of thanksgiving. **The Mission Commitment Project** for November is the Jay and Briana Stokes family who are serving with Ethnos360 (formerly called New Tribes Mission) on the Papua Island of Indonesia. They work with the Dem tribe.

Through Ethnos360, Christian missionaries do Bible translation and evangelism to plant churches among unreached people groups around the world.

Learning the Dem language, which is unwritten, has been a major challenge for Jay, although he reports making slow and steady progress. Dem people are at their house every day. The language difficulty prevents them from much verbal communication but they show them love and provide simple medications such as Aspirin and Tylenol.



The **Vision Project** for November is The Ministries at Main Street, headed by Kork Moyer.

Located in Pottstown, this ministry provides food and overnight shelter for homeless and needy persons. The Shelter season runs from November through April.

Several Pottstown churches each provide sleeping quarters for one month of the season. Donations from church and organizations help fund the expenses of meals, personal items and bedding.

### The Shepherd's Theological Institute

The Shepherd's Theological Institute has partnered with the Institute of Theology to bring you a fully accredited Bible College experience. The program we offer leads to a Certificate of Christian Ministry and is four semesters long. Each semester, sixteen weeks, students will take one class focusing on either Discipleship, Old testament or New testament.

Students will gather weekly for class with their cohort group, growing together as believers and closer in their walk with God. This will be the same group they meet with for the duration of the program. Each week's class will consist of prayer, group discussion of the week's lesson, and a short quiz. There will be a final exam at the end of the course but don't worry - you will be well prepared and all the questions come from your weekly quizzes.

The purpose of the class is to better equip believers for Christian service and to improve overall biblical literacy. If you are interested in joining one of our courses beginning in the new year all you need is to be a believer, at least 16 years old, involved in your church, and have the support of your pastor – THAT'S IT!
