The Bible provides a great example of believers intentionally getting connected with the local church, and membership is how we do that. Our membership classes run for three weeks where you'll learn about the church, ministries, and get a chance to discover your personal gifts and how you can use them here.

Other things are coming up as well. Financial Peace University starts this month, Confirmation is coming in May, and of course we will be celebrating Mother's Day and Father's Day, we're looking to schedule a baptism event, and our youth are preparing for their mission trip to Easton this summer. Our Wednesday night services are also going well, as is the radio ministry.

Don and Christine Ames are our March Mission Commitment project. They have served with La Mission in Florida for about 13 years, providing support services to missionaries and mission stations. This often included travel to other countries where Don's skills as an electrician were highly valued. In the past year they have retired from full-time active service although still continuing with projects from time to time.

The Vision Project for March is Bridge the Gap Ministries in Belieze. John and Beate Vandermark head this ministry which disciples youth in the faith and trains them in a vocational skill such as computers or diesel engine repair, for example.

In the summer 2013 our youth went on a mission trip to their location. Many changes have occurred since then—with new buildings going up and older ones expanded.
