# SANCTITY OF LIFE SUNDAY JANUARY 27

Rev Kirk van der Swaagh will be the guest speaker for our observance of Sanctity of Life Sunday.

He has served as pastor of Neighborhood Church of Greenwich Village since 1987. In addition, he serves as vice-president on the board of the National Pro-life Religious Council. Kirk has led workshops with fellow NPRC board members at the annual National Right to Life convention and contributed devotional selections to the 40 Days for Life prayer guide.

In the late 1980s, Kirk was an active participant in Operation Rescue, working with others to impede access to abortion clinics, while challenging the clinic workers to examine their consciences in the light of the practice they were supporting.

He also serves as director of the Expect Hope project, which is a Christ-centered residential, restorative program offered as an alternative to abortion for single pregnant women. Women are housed free for two years and receive life skills teaching and assistance in job placement as well as physical, emotional and spiritual support from mentors and staff.

Kirk graduated with highest honors from New Brunswick Theological Seminary, obtaining a Master of Divinity. He and his wife Barbara have six children.
