Michael Ciccocioppo will be a guest speaker at our worship services on Sanctity of Life Sunday, January 8.

Michael has served as the executive director of the Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federation since 2002. He helps Pennsylvanians understand the truth behind abortion, infanticide and euthanasia. He energizes pro-lifers at the grassroots to work for a society that respects human life from conception to natural death.

Prior to this, he served as a professional hospital administrator from 1991 – 2002 as vice president at Holy Spirit Hospital in Camp Hill and from 1970 – 1991 in various positions and units on active duty in the United States Air Force Medical Service throughout the United States and Europe.

He has a Master of Health Administration degree from Baylor University. He is a Fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives and served on the professional society's international Council of Regents from 1995-2000.

A native of Pennsylvania, Michael was born and grew up in the greater Harrisburg area where he resides with his wife of 42 years, Peggy. They have four grown children and five grandsons. He is the eldest of 15 children. His father, Michael sr., is deceased. His mother, Blanche, also resides in the area and enjoys her 46 grandchildren and 27 (so far) great-grandchildren.

The Pennsylvania Pro-Life Federations, based in Harrisburg, is the statewide affiliate of the National Right to Life Committee. The Federation is non-profit, nonsectarian, and nonpartisan. It is the largest single-issue pro-life organization in the Commonwealth with over 40 countywide chapters and over 50,000 individual members.

Well, hello Shepherd! Here we are and another year has come and gone. Goodbye 2016, hello 2017! And with the New Year doubtless you are making plans for holiday, birthdays, vacations, trips, outings and everything else that we fill our calendars with. For us, we look forward to Owen entering first grade; Sierra going to preschool; and Noah learning to walk and talk. We're looking forward to the summer and what things we might do, and already making plans for next Thanksgiving and Christmas

The beginning of the year means planning, and planning is good. Jesus would commend the kind

of forethought involved in planning our lives. He said, "For which of you, desiring to build a tower, does not first sit down and count the cost, whether he has enough to complete it?" (Luke 14:28) It is a Godly thing to plan. Jeremiah writes, "I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord." (Jeremiah 29:11) The psalmist writes, "The counsel of the Lord stands forever, the plans of His heart to all generations." (Psalm 33:11) God plans and He encourages us to plan, but it comes with a condition: that we plan according to God's will.

In the Book of James, he writes, "Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go into such and such a town and spend a year there and trade and make a profit"— yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes. Instead you ought to say, 'If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that." (James 4:13-15) James instructs us to plan, but to do so in God's will and to put first things first.

It is God that grants us the gift of life, so first we recognize that. Without life, we could do nothing at all. Then, after getting the basics down we yield to God, "*If the Lord wills, we will live and do this or that.*" Not that we do not plan, we are encouraged to plan... it is Godly to plan... but always with submission to His will. And when we do, something great happens: we become much more willing to follow Christ, whatever and wherever that means. This past Christmas season, we looked at how Mary made plans to marry Joseph and have a normal life, until Gabriel showed up. Gabriel told Mary her plans would have to change to accommodate God's will and she responded by saying, "*Let it be to me according to your word.*" (Luke 1:38)

It is exciting to look forward to events and activities we plan, and we should plan for the future. But when you do, let me encourage you to keep God's will in mind and be ready for whatever He has planned for your life. I hope you have a great month, stay warm and God bless!

The Meaning of Epiphany

Epiphany, which comes from the Greek word epiphaneia, means "an appearance" or "a revealing." Centuries ago, the church set aside January 6, the 12th day after Christmas, to mark the revealing of Jesus as Christ to the wise men, who were Gentiles. Jesus' first followers were Jewish, so the revelation of the divine Christ to the non-Jewish magi reminds us that Jesus came to earth to save the whole world.



 $Symbols of Epiphany include light, a {\it star}, a {\it crown}$

(or three crowns) and a globe or stylized portrayal of the world. The color of Epiphany is green to symbolize life, growth, hope and eternity.

On the church calendar, the Epiphany season lasts until Ash Wednesday, which is determined by the date of Easter.
